- Stable left ventricular size and function
 - No overt signs of cardiomyopathy
- Trace tricuspid valve regurgitation

Medications

- No cardiac medications are recommended at this time.

- Helo can continue in the breeding program
- Helo is currently at low risk for clinical signs of his/her heart disease. However, please monitor for signs of cough, respiratory difficulty, exercise intolerance, weakness, or lethargy. If you note any of these symptoms, please notify CVCA or Dr. as these symptoms may indicate worsening of Helo's heart disease.

Reevaluation

- Recheck with Annapolis Cat Hospital for routine examinations
- Recheck here with CVCA yearly (while in the breeding program) or sooner if a murmur is noted

Echocardiographic Findings

ECHO: stable upper limits of normal LV wall thickness, normal LV systolic function, normal LA size - area and diameter, no masses or effusions noted, regular rhythm throughout the exam, normal LVOT and RVOT velocities, trace TR, moderator band noted mid LV
